WHY Sprinkle some exotic spice over your Christmas with a trip to Morocco. Hot Marrakech is home to a wave of cool hunters, artists and designers **FESTIVE TREATS** Dar Les Cigognes, a stunning eleven-room riad, with spa and hammam, has put together a Christmas and shopping package that helps you track down bargain finds, out-of-the-way treasures and have a mellow Yule. You'll get a Christmas like you've never experienced before - a traditional Christmas mass at the Catholic church of Gueliz, Saint Martyrs, with the Choir of Marrakech singing Christmas carols with an African rhythm. Afterwards, guests take a horse and carriage along the festively lit streets before champagne and canapés by the fire at the hotel, then dinner to the haunting sounds of Andalucian and Gnawa music, and storytelling. They have also culled the best of the souk's offerings for your bargain hunting, then you can relax with a massage in the hammam (treat yourself to a henna tattoo) PLUS The hotel's restaurant serves local speciality dishes that change according to what's

available at the market and are so delicious they've just published their own cookbook; the rooftop café has breathtaking views of the Atlas Mountains; staff are fantastically knowledgeable about all the best boutiques, cafés and sights **NEARBY** You're well placed to make shopping forays into the humming Medina, since Dar Les Cigognes is within walking distance from Djemaa el Fna and the warren-like souk.
